

What is UCLA EMS?

In 1979, UCLA established its own emergency medical service (EMS) as a response to the ever-growing campus and its increased demand for emergency medical care. UCLA EMS has since grown into one of the most respected basic life support, primary response programs in the country.

EMS-1, the campus 911 response ambulance, is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. It responds to approximately 1,200 medical aid calls annually on campus and in the surrounding community. About half of our patients are students, faculty and staff, with the remainder being visitors to the UCLA community.



EMTs work out of the UCLA Police Department where they serve as station officers at the front counter between medical aid responses. Duties here include assisting the public, writing police reports, managing the campus lost and found, and participating in community service projects, such as giving tours of the ambulance to children. Additionally, our EMTs stand by at many of the special events on campus to provide emergency medical coverage.



UCLA EMS works closely with Los Angeles City Fire Department Paramedics who provide advanced life support backup for the care of critically ill or injured patients.



Why join UCLA EMS?

UCLA EMS provides an experience unlike any other student job. Through extensive on-the-job training and direct patient contact on a day-to-day basis, EMTs mature and develop the confidence they need to excel in any field.

EMTs who have successfully made it through our program have had outstanding success after graduation. Of the last 20 EMTs to leave our program in good standing:

- 13 went to Medical School !!
- 2 went to Public Health School
- 1 went to Nursing School
- 3 went to Paramedic School
- 1 went to Law School

100% of our EMTs who have applied to medical school have been accepted !!

How to join UCLA EMS

Applicants interested in joining UCLA EMS must have the following:

- Current California EMT certification
If you are not certified as an EMT, contact us for further information and assistance with course enrollment. You may also contact the UCLA Center for Pre-hospital Care directly for course information (see back of brochure).
- Current enrollment as UCLA graduate or undergraduate student, full time
- Minimum of 1 year remaining in school
- Grade point average above 2.0
- Valid California Driver's License at time of application

Successful applicants pass a series of rigorous evaluations to be hired by UCLA EMS, which include a written exam, physical agility test, practical skills assessment, group interview, formal interview, and background check.

UCLA EMS hires EMTs twice per year, generally at the beginning of the fall and spring quarters, however applications may be submitted year around.
